Dear Board: Please see the following update for tonight's meeting.

<u>Downtown Planning Public Forum – May 14:</u> A public forum to discuss downtown planning initiatives is scheduled for <u>Tuesday, May 14 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m.</u> in the historic Carnegie portion of the Athol Public Library. This forum builds upon a grant-funded exercise to envision short- and long-term action steps to improve conditions in the downtown area. BSC Group of Worcester is facilitating the effort with the Town Manager's office, Dept. of Public Works and Dept. of Planning and Development.



As you are aware, to date there have been several staff-level meetings and a public meeting with the Downtown Vitality Committee and the consultants. A desired outcome is to recommend action items to the Board of Selectmen so that policy guidance may be issued to staff. All are encouraged to attend and participate.


Exchange Street Bridget Project to Advance: A pre-construction meeting will be held this week with MIG Corp., of Acton, relative to reconstruction of the Exchange Street Bridget. The nearly \$2.9 million contract was awarded in April and work is expected to be complete by the end of calendar year 2019. More information on the scheduling, traffic controls and more will be forthcoming after the start-up session. Any traffic detours will be shared with the public in advance of the commencement of work.

# Millers River Environmental Center Accessible Lift Project Underway:

Project architect Haynes, Lieneck & Smith has approved final submittals by Cornerstone Builders to initiate the installation of the accessible lift at 100 Main Street. This project is a true partnership between taxpayers and the private fundraising and gift of the Athol Bird and Nature Club.

Mobilization and work began on yesterday and it is hoped that the project will be complete within 30 days though older buildings can reveal hidden conditions.

<u>GreenCleanAthol</u>: On April 27 a town-wide cleanup day driven primarily by volunteers was a tremendous success. Nearly 100



people came out under initially damp skies to collect **over two tons of trash and roughly 600 used tires** from the community. With assists from the Athol DPW, Pete's Tire Barns and community service workers from the court system the day was a resounding success. At a de-briefing meeting on Monday night it was agreed that the Town would participate with the volunteers for both a spring and fall cleanup event.
