Dear Board: Please see following update for tonight's meeting.

<u>All-Alcoholic Beverages Pouring License Quota</u>: Under MGL c. 138, sec. 17, Athol has a limit of 14 allalcohol pouring licenses (Section 12 licenses) that it can issue with only <u>three</u> such licenses currently available. As the Board is aware, the Town desires additional restaurant, pub and lodging opportunities for both public convenience and economic development purposes, and a pouring license is typically a critical path item in these business plans.

With only three licenses available – and now with four parties having recently expressed interest in securing a pouring license there is <u>potential that Athol will have</u> <u>no further capacity</u> to offer liquor licenses for restaurants or lodging facilities.

Therefore, I am seeking the Board's policy direction on whether the Town should seek to either "opt out" of MGL c. 138, sec. 17 (would effectively remove any quota), or, develop a plan to seek special legislation to increase the current quota from 14 to a reasonable higher number (eg. 20 maximum). Either option will require authorization from Town Meeting and I would recommend seeking approval in October.

Fire Department Chief Search: I have taken under advisement the recommendation of the fire chief search committee relative to retaining an interim fire chief. Following a meeting with outgoing Chief Duguay and Deputy Chief Parker on Friday, August 31, the Deputy Chief has assumed day-to-day operational management of the fire department in accordance with his existing job description. He has also coordinated a supervisory framework of operations with the department captains and I am confident in the Department's ability to carry forth all field operations. I will revisit the committee's suggestion should it appear that the vacancy will exist for an extended period of time.

Miscellaneous:

- Retained architect Paul Lieneck of Haynes, Lieneck & Smith to review and coordinate needed cupola repairs with upcoming roof maintenance or replacement at Town Hall
- Participated on town of Templeton interview panel for municipal management fellow recruitment
- Attended annual senior picnic at Silver Lake Park
- Met with DPW Supt. and Asst. Supt. and LED streetlight project vendor procured through the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission and Mass. DOER grant
